15:00 – 16:30 | Study Visit to the Hydrogen Laboratory of the University of Crete Onsite visit to the Department of Chemistry at the University of Crete will be offered to participants, where valuable insights into cutting-edge research in the field of advanced porous materials for hydrogen storage will be gained. A lab tour will be provided by Prof. Pantelis N. Trikalitis and his team, during which key elements of their hydrogen storage research will be explained and some of the state-of-the-art instruments used to study the properties of advanced materials for on-board hydrogen storage applications will be showcased. These materials, which belong to the family of metalorganic frameworks (MOFs), are considered to hold great promise for solving the hydrogen storage challenge. Following the lab tour, a presentation on the current state-of-the-art in hydrogen storage research will be given by Prof. Trikalitis, with a focus on MOST-H2, a major EU-funded project involving 16 partners working on an integrated multiscale, lab-to-tank approach to develop, validate, and demonstrate innovative, low-cost, cryo-adsorptive hydrogen storage systems. An open discussion will follow, providing participants with the opportunity to gain further insights into the hydrogen storage problem and potential solutions.
